Dear Parents and Carers,

As a part of your child's education at Tackley Primary School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives children the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

I am writing to let you know that this term the theme for each class's PSHE is 'Growing Up'. In Anning (nursery and reception), children will begin to develop a positive sense of themselves and others; form positive relationships with others; develop respect for others and develop an awareness of similarities and differences between people. In Jemison children will learn about their own and others' bodies, gender stereotypes and different types of families. They will learn about respecting their own and others' bodies, keeping their bodies safe and sharing their feelings in response to life experiences. In Webb the focus is on how we grow and change, both physically and emotionally. Children will learn about their own and others' bodies and how male and female bodies play a part in human reproduction. They will also learn about different relationships and family structures. In Attenborough learning builds on children's knowledge of how we grow and change, both physically and emotionally, and the types of relationships that people have. Children will learn about sexual relationships, they will also learn about positive body images and stereotypes; becoming more independent; keeping safe; consent; developing self-esteem and confidence. Pupils have opportunities to ask questions.

PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body. All PSHE teaching takes place will take place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school ethos and values.
